DIRECTION & SCRIPT:

Newton?", his award winning one person show, and 1984, his critically acclaimed stage adaptation of George Orwell's dystopic novel. 1984 opened at the Actor's Gang Theater under the Direction of Tim Robbins in 2006, and has since been performed in Europe, Asia, Australia, South America, and has had several tours of the United States. Pat Moran (SFMT Collective, Musical Director, Composer, Lyricist, Musician) began his involvement with the Mime Troupe during 2005's *Doing Good* and has worked on every show since. Pat has been a lead teacher with the Mime Troupe's Youth Theater Project and is an active educator and advocate for the importance of socially conscious art. In addition to his work with the Troupe, he is a freelance composer/musician/guitar teacher fluent in a wide variety of musical styles. PERFORMERS:

Michael Bello (Musician) has been playing and writing music since he was a wee little boy. Tristan Cunningham (Understudy) started her performing days when she was only ten with Vermont's own country circus, Circus Smirkus. After touring for eight years, she decided to change her focus to acting and recently graduated from S.U.N.Y Purchase Acting Conservatory. Joel's musical experiences came together on his 2006 solo album *Dynokaleido* on which he played, recorded, and mixed drumset, percussion, piano, Hammond and Lowrey Organs, Rhodes and Wurlitzer electric pianos, synths, autoharp, marimba, balaphon, quitar, and bass guitar.

Ed Holmes (SFMT Collective, Actor) has been performing and teaching in the bay area for the past 4 decades.
